**CIRCULAR**

**Subject: Strict compliance regarding submission of Anti-Ragging Compliance Reports on NDC Anti-Ragging Portal – reg.**

It has been observed with serious concern that a number of dental colleges/institutions have failed to upload the mandatory Anti-Ragging Compliance Report for April, 2026 within the prescribed timeline i.e. by 30.04.2026 on the NDC/DCI Anti-Ragging Portal. The portal was automatically closed after expiry of the prescribed timeline.

Subsequently, numerous requests have been received from defaulting institutions seeking reopening of the portal for submission of pending reports.

In this regard, all dental colleges/institutions are hereby informed that submission of Anti-Ragging Reports on the NDC Anti-Ragging Portal is a mandatory statutory/regulatory obligation and any failure or delay in compliance shall be treated as a serious lapse on the part of the institution and its administration.

The responsibility for timely and correct submission of the reports shall lie with the Head of the Institution. Excuses such as administrative oversight, change of staff, lack of technical knowledge, portal-related assumptions, or internal institutional issues shall not be entertained by the Commission.

However, as a final opportunity and without creating any precedent, the NDC Anti-Ragging Portal is being reopened till **20.06.2026** solely for submission of pending Anti-Ragging Reports for April, 2026.

All defaulting institutions are directed to upload the pending reports within the aforesaid extended period positively. No further extension/reopening of the portal shall be considered thereafter under any circumstances.

It is further informed that failure to comply with the prescribed timelines in future, including delayed/non-submission/incomplete submission of Anti-Ragging Reports, shall invite strict regulatory action by the Commission. Such non-compliance may be taken into account during inspections/assessments and may adversely impact consideration of applications relating to renewal of permissions, increase of seats, recognition, continuation of courses, and other regulatory matters concerning the institution.

The Commission may also place instances of persistent or repeated default on record for appropriate action against the concerned institution under the applicable provisions of the National Dental Commission Act, 2023 and regulations framed thereunder.

All institutions are, therefore, advised to treat this matter with utmost priority and seriousness.
